

Chicago-St. Petersburg High School Partnership Партнерский проект школ Санкт-Петербурга и Чикаго



Chicago and St. Petersburg are, arguably, the two most fascinating cities in their respective countries. Both cities share interesting and in many ways similar histories. Both are planned cities in the frigid north renowned throughout the world for their art and architecture. Both have major rivers with canals and major bodies of waters at their borders. Both have been important centers of political and labor movements over the past two centuries. Today, the presidents of Russia and the United States come from these cities. Two cities with intriguingly similar stories have been separated by distance and politics for decades. It makes sense then to connect young people from these two cities together through the Chicago-St. Petersburg High School Partnership.

Chicago Public Schools and St. Petersburg Public Schools in partnership with the University of St. Petersburg and Chicago university and civic organizations propose to create partnership opportunities for high schools in our respective cities.

This partnership is the product of an exchange initiated by delegates from Chicago Public Schools and St. Petersburg University. Delegates from Chicago and St. Petersburg visited schools, civic organizations, and government agencies in order to gain an understanding of schools and youth development systems as well as explore opportunities for collaboration. Following the mutual visits, schools and teachers, in both cities expressed great interest in creating classroom-to-classroom linkages.

School partnerships will enable students to explore the arts, history and politics, youth development, neighborhoods, environmental action, and civic engagement together. This joint project of Chicago and St. Petersburg has the potential to engage students in issues of local and global interest, contribute to positive relationships between our two cities and countries, and, we believe, lead to the development of a model that can take advantage of technology to foster stronger relationships among young people around the world.





The Chicago-St. Petersburg High School Partnership, which we hope can one day develop into a face-to-face partnership, can be an important step toward building bridges between these two wonderful countries at a time when relationships need strengthening. The will of educators and young people in our two cities is promising and can lead to new opportunities for understanding and relationship building.
